Project Overview

Early childhood education informs the importance of early years' stimulation and intervention during the first 2000 days of a child's life. A child who receives appropriate stimulation has good pre-academic outcomes, especially if the intervention was given to poor families. On the other hand, if the child experiences inappropriate stimulation during the period, the negative results will be irreversible.

Early Learning Center is one of the FMCH flagship projects to ensure that the children from poor families receive early stimulation and education they need. FMCH, locally known as Yayasan Balita Sehat (YBS) operates ELC in Jakarta, Bogor, West Java and Soe, Timor, NTT.

YBS employs experienced ECE tutors to create a secure and joyful environment for children aged three to six. Through playful learning, the curriculum focuses on developing language, mathematics, motoric, cognitive and social skills. Preschool attendance usually five mornings per week and feeding program is occasionally provided. Activities include painting, gluing, outdoor play, singing/musical, storytelling and field trips.

Financial Snapshot

By the end of 2022, Mr. Richard Hamilton (Chaplin Bros) generously donated USD 7,060.25 or approximately IDR 106 million. YBS allocated these funds to support the monthly salaries of teaching staff at ELC, spread across Jakarta, Bojong Gede (West Java), and Soe (Timor, NTT) for the entire duration of January to December 2023.

Key Milestones Reached

The funds provided are instrumental in compensating 29 early childhood tutors across 14 ELCs, enabling the implementation of teaching and learning activities for a total of 393 students in one year. Further details regarding the beneficiaries of the funds are outlined in the table below:
